A. Book

A book is a collection of written, printed, or illustrated pages that are bound together to form a single publication. It will be considered as final project if it has **ISBN** and there will be **an examination** about the contents of the book.

The following are some of the characteristics of the book:

1. **Content:** The content of a book can be fiction or non-fiction and can cover a wide range of subjects, including history, science, literature, and many others.
2. **Length:** The length of a book should be minimum of 100 pages long.
3. **Structure:** A book often has a well-defined structure, including an introduction, main body, and conclusion. Some books may also have additional elements such as footnotes, appendices, and indices.
4. **Audience:** The intended audience for a book can vary widely, from children to adults, and can be general or specialized.
5. **Purpose:** The purpose of a book can also vary from entertaining, informing, persuading, or educating its readers.
6. **Format:** Books can come in a variety of formats, including hardcover, softcover, or electronic.
7. **Illustrations:** Many books include illustrations, such as photographs, drawings, or maps, to help explain or supplement the text.
8. **Writing Style:** The writing style of a book can vary greatly, from formal and academic to conversational and informal.
9. **Page set up:** Paper size is UNESCO-standard (15,5x23 cm), font size 12, and space 1,5.
10. **Writers:** the students involved as the writers are maximum 15 students.

B. Book Chapter

4. **Tone:** The tone of a book chapter should be consistent with the overall tone of the book and should contribute to the book's overall voice and style.
5. **Integration:** A book chapter should fit into the overall structure and narrative of the book and should contribute to the book's overall argument or purpose.
6. **Audience:** The audience for a book chapter is the same as the audience for the book.
7. **Reference:** Book chapters often include references to other sources and literature to support the arguments and claims made within the chapter.
8. **Page set up:** Paper size is UNESCO-standard (15,5x23 cm), font size 12, and space 1,5.
9. **Writers:** the students involved as the writers are maximum 15 students.
10. **Advisors:** The advisors will be written as the editor of the book.

3. **Methodology:** A good research article includes a detailed and rigorous methodology that is clearly described and can be replicated by other researchers.
4. **Data Analysis:** A good research article includes a thorough and accurate analysis of data that supports the conclusions drawn from the research.
5. **Clarity:** A good research article is well-written and easy to understand, with clear explanations and a logical flow of information.
6. **Objectivity:** A good research article is objective and free from bias, presenting the results of the research objectively and without interpretation.
7. **References:** A good research article includes a comprehensive and up-to-date list of references that demonstrate the depth and breadth of the researcher's knowledge and understanding of the field of study.
8. **Implications:** A good research article includes a discussion of the implications of the research results for the field of study and for wider society.

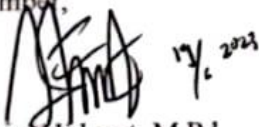
