- 1. *Content*: The content of a book can be fiction or non-fiction and can cover a wide range of subjects, including history, science, literature, and many others.
- 2. Length: The length of a book should be minimum of 100 pages long.
- Structure: A book often has a well-defined structure, including an introduction, main body, and
 conclusion. Some books may also have additional elements such as footnotes, appendices, and
 indices.
- 4. *Audience*: The intended audience for a book can vary widely, from children to adults, and can be general or specialized.
- 5. *Purpose*: The purpose of a book can also vary from entertaining, informing, persuading, or educating its readers.
- 6. Format: Books can come in a variety of formats, including hardcover, softcover, or electronic.
- 7. *Illustrations*: Many books include illustrations, such as photographs, drawings, or maps, to help explain or supplement the text.
- 8. Writing Style: The writing style of a book can vary greatly, from formal and academic to conversational and informal.
- 9. Page set up: Paper size is UNESCO-standard (15,5x23 cm), font size 12, and space 1,5.

- 5. *Integration*: A book chapter should fit into the overall structure and narrative of the book and should contribute to the book's overall argument or purpose.
- 6. Audience: The audience for a book chapter is the same as the audience for the book.
- 7. **Reference**: Book chapters often include references to other sources and literature to support the arguments and claims made within the chapter.
- 8. Page set up: Paper size is UNESCO-standard (15,5x23 cm), font size 12, and space 1,5.
- 9. Writers: the students involved as the writers are maximum 15 students.
- 10. Advisors: The advisors will be written as the editor of the book.

- 5. *Clarity*: A good research article is well-written and easy to understand, with clear explanations and a logical flow of information.
- 6. *Objectivity*: A good research article is objective and free from bias, presenting the results of the research objectively and without interpretation.
- References: A good research article includes a comprehensive and up-to-date list of
 references that demonstrate the depth and breadth of the researcher's knowledge and
 understanding of the field of study.
- 8. *Implications*: A good research article includes a discussion of the implications of the research results for the field of study and for wider society.
